All-Night Opulence: [Hotel Indigo](#)

Spend the evening in Chelsea's recently opened luxury hotel. Don't worry about planning, chocolate-covered cherries and chilled sparkling wine will be waiting in your room upon your arrival. The night won't just be spent in bed, because dinner for two at Blu Restaurant and Bar is included.

Brooklyn Bistro: [DuMont](#)

Right off of the L train is a cozy gem with outdoor, heated dining that feels more secret garden than Kings County. Crispy artichokes are exquisite, and the prime sirloin is worth the trek alone. If you don't opt for the wine pairings, try excellent house cocktails, like the rye-based Sazerac or a sage julep.

Celebrity Classic: [David Burke's Townhouse](#)

Any opportunity to get a five-course meal courtesy of Mr. Burke is cause to celebrate, especially when the menu is handpicked by the man himself. Choices are ideal for foodie dates, with Hudson Valley foie gras or a duck tenderloin salad for apps, and main courses like gingerbread spiced lamb or blackened cod with gnocchi. End the evening with his famous bubblegum and raspberry-whipped cheesecake lollipops — if you've got room.

Before a night of clubbing, dine at this stylishly rustic Meatpacking destination with exposed bricks, three fireplaces and a spacious interior.
